Statement of the staff of the Center for Humanistic Education / December 2008

We hear joy over the dead "on the other side" and remember what we have learned here how easily individuality can be lost in a crowd.

We believe, amidst these dark days of hatred and despair, in the good within humans and its capacity to overcome the evil inside.

We call upon all our partners who share these beliefs to raise a loud and clear voice together: for talking instead of fighting, against war, in favor of humans and humanity!
